Peter had a passion for the water. At the age of 16 he owned his own sailing boat and won trophies for races in 1949 and more in 1953. Peter sailed with many of his friends in 18 footers and won trophies. Peter took part in the Sydney to Hobart race in the early '60s and they were defending champions in New Zealand on 18 footers. 1964 was a memorable year when he was part of a crew who won "World 18ft Sailing Championship". Peter was also club captain of the "NSW 18ft Sailing League Club" in Double Bay.



In 1966 Peter married Dawn (Williams) at Windellama Church where Keith Stephens performed the service. Peter and Dawn had two girls Kylie and Lana while living in Sydney. Peter worked as a green keeper and at poker machine factory.

Peter took the job of sales, service and delivery of poker machines in Goulburn. The family moved to Windellama in 1973 where Peter also took his hand to farming and much community work. Peter was President of the Windellama Progress Association for many years and was made a life member.

Peter was well known for his building ability and concrete work , and much can be seen around Windellama Hall. No sooner was a task mentioned than peter would have a tram of volunteers lined and the job was done.

Peter became "Honorary Secretary" at the Goulburn Railway Institute Bowling Club.

In 1998 Dawn and Peter decided to move and make their home at Batemans Bay.

Keith Stephens conducted his funeral service on 29<sup>th</sup> June at Batemans Bay.

Peter is survived by his wife Dawn, daughters Kylie and Lana and their grandchildren. Peter will be sadly missed by all who knew and loved him.

## FARMING WINDELLAMA

### How Many Livestock Should I keep?

For those planning to graze livestock in the Windellama district the first question to be answered is "How many should I keep to get the best return on my investment?"

The answer depends on the pasture available and the growth of that pasture throughout the year.

Carrying capacity is rated as how many wethers (de sexed sheep) can be run on one hectare of pasture. This is called a Dry Sheep Equivalent (DSE) and is calculated on the area of land that is required to sustain a 50kg wether over a twelve month period.

Stocking rates recommended by the NSW Dept. of Primary Industries for pasture types found in the Windellama district are as follows:

<u>DSE/ha</u>	<u>Pasture Type</u>	<u>DSE/HA</u>
	Poor native pasture (most of Windellama)	1.0*
	Good native pasture	2.5
	Native pasture with clover and superphosphate	5.0

\*This means on poor native pasture the maximum one hectare can support throughout the year is one wether.

If you plan to run other types of livestock DSE ratings still apply.

<u>Class of Livestock</u>	<u>DSE Rating</u>	<u>DSE when lactating*</u>
Sheep	1.0	3.4
Goat (dairy)	1.5	3.5
Alpaca	1.0	2.0
Deer	1.2	
Pony	6.0	9.0
Horse	13.5	18.0
Cattle (550kg)	10.0	16.5

Therefore a steer will require ten times more feed than a wether so will require ten hectares of native pasture to survive.



\*Feed requirements for breeding animals are considerably higher than for dry ones. The DSE ratings for the same animal can change through the year. For instance a dry ewe is about one DSE, a pregnant ewe 1.5 and a lactating ewe 3.4 DSE. So 100 ewes can range from 100 DSE to 340 DSE.

As locally there is negligible native pasture growth through the colder months of the year supplementary feeding will be necessary to maintain satisfactory animal production.



Prepare your vegetable and flower gardens for Spring planting .Dig in compost and old manure and handful of lime per metre.

## VEGETABLES

Seeds;- Carrots, parsnip, lettuce, silver beet, onions, peas.

Plants;- Cabbage, lettuce, silver beet onions.

Asparagus and rhubarb crowns can also go in now. You can divide old crowns and separate them, and replant them in fertile soil.

## FLOWERS

Seeds which can be sown during August- petunia, phlox.

Seedlings of pansy, viola, stocks, snapdragons, aquilegia, carnations, dianthus, primula, dwarf sweet William, alyssum, poppies and larkspur.

You can still prune your fruit trees now. Roses can also be pruned, spray with lime Sulphur and remove old diseased leaves from the ground and put them in the garbage bin.

Spray apples, pear, plum, quince with Winter oil, this controls mite and scale.

Spray peach and nectarine with lime Sulphur no later than pinking of the buds to control leaf curl.

Propagate fig trees by striking hardwood cutting.

## METHOD FOR HARDWOOD CUTTINGS

Hardwood is from last season`s growth, located further down the stem from the season just gone. The stem will be thicker, and the bark will be darker.

Take the cutting about 15cm long, and between pencil and finger thickness. Remove any remaining leaves. Cut the top flat and the bottom 45-degree angle, so you can tell the difference.

Dab the angled end of the cutting into rooting hormone gel or powder, or honey. Put the cutting in pre-made hole in coarse potting mix. Insert to about half the length of the cutting. Multiple cutting can go in the same pot. Water, and keep moist. In mid-spring or early summer, when leaves and roots have developed, carefully separate the cuttings and re-pot or plant out.

Always use sharp cutting tools, as blunt tools can bruise the cells alongside the cut, and impede root development. Use clean pots and tools.

With chains-a-sawing, whippers snipping and secateurs clipping, our intrepid joint army marched ever onward felling every dead or feral tree & branch in its path.

After a break for morning tea in the sunshine it was back to slashing, dragging and lugging the vegetation to the mountainous bonfire pile awaiting other helpers who will burn off after the RFS has been notified.

(A warning to the people in the Windellama-Mayfield-Tarago-Lower Boro area who have been lighting big fires recently burning off vegetation – even during winter you must notify Yass (phone 0262263100) 24 hours before burning off and also warn your neighbours as well as Windellama RFS. Penalty for failure to do so \$5500 and/or 12 months imprisonment. )

## Accidents

While looking through the Goulburn newspapers with the help of the searching tool TROVE, that has digitised newspapers from all over Australia, I came across mention of numerous accidents that happened to the people of Windellama. Let's look at some of them. Perhaps horse accidents were even more common than car accidents today.

Accident with horse and cart. Last Saturday week a son of Mr. Samuel Hockey's met with a painful accident. He was driving a cart laden with a ton and a half of metal for the road near Bungonia, and while in the act of putting the brake on going down a hill his load slipped under the dray and it passed over his foot mangling it greatly, but happily he is now nearly recovered.

Horse accident. As Mrs. Gleeson was proceeding to Goulburn last Monday her horse threw her and kicked her violently but no bones were broken and she is now nearly well.

*(Goulburn Evening Penny Post 13 December 1881 Page 4)*

Thrown from horse. A son of Mr. Stengis, a lad about 18 years of age, met with a painful accident on Sunday last. It appears he had been to a friend's place, and had mounted his horse in order to return home, but by some unaccountable means before he had proceeded far he was thrown heavily on the ground. When found he was insensible, but appeared not to be hurt externally, as only a little blood was coming from his nose. A messenger was dispatched to his father and then to Goulburn for a medical man; but, as the distance is considerable, it was about midday on Monday before the doctor arrived, and as I had no word since Monday morning early, I cannot give the extent of the injuries received.

(Note that the paper had the name as Stengis but it would most likely be Sturgiss.)

*(Goulburn Evening Penny Post 8 April 1882 Page 5)*

Horse and buggy accident. Mr. J. Dennis, manager of the Hidden Treasure Gold and Silver Mine, and Mr. McKane met with an accident on Tuesday afternoon last near Lansdowne Bridge. They were returning from Windellama in a buggy, and just as they crossed the bridge the horses swerved and bolted, the buggy going partially over the embankment and throwing out the driver, Mr. McKane, who had however succeeded in restraining the animals. Although he fell under the wheel, Mr. McKane stuck to the reins, and the horses were turned on to the road again. He was however, unable to retain his hold, and the horses bolting across the road, Mr. Dennis was thrown out. The horses kept on their way, but were stopped at the railway gates before any damage had been done to the vehicle. Both gentlemen escaped with slight injuries.

*(Goulburn Evening Penny Post 19 April 1888 Page 2)*

Spirited horses. On Tuesday morning one of our neighbours, Mr. T. Cartwright, met with a slight accident. It appears he had a pair of rather spirited horses in a buggy; they became very stubborn and would not go; when the driver used the whip they began kicking and smashed the buggy-pole; but the occupants of the trap received no injury, and no further damage was done.

*(Goulburn Herald 28 November 1890 Page 4)*

Bucking horse. The cricketers did not finish their day's cricket on last Saturday very satisfactorily, for just as they were about to start for home one of the club was thrown from his horse, and sustained rather severe injuries. It appears that the sufferer, Joseph Harvey of Windellama, a member of the Bronti cricket club, was leaving the cricket ground with another cricketer, Mr. Boreham, when they commenced racing, and the horse Harvey was riding being a young one began bucking, throwing his rider heavily against a log.



He laid as though he were dead, and when picked up was seen to be bleeding at the nose, mouth, and ears, being stunned by the blow and receiving some dreadful bruises about his head, which came in contact with the log above mentioned. A horseman was dispatched to Braidwood for medical assistance, which arrived at 2 o'clock on Sunday morning. He was a little relieved by the medical attention. The patient is now suffering from concussion of the brain, but there are hopes of his recovery.

*(Goulburn Evening Penny Post 12 March 1891 Page 4)*

The sufferer from the accident on the 7th instant, Joseph Harvey, is progressing favourably under the medical assistance of Dr. Florence of Braidwood. I hear he was to have been conveyed home on, Monday, but I do not know if this step has yet been taken.

*(Goulburn Herald 25 March 1891 Page 2)*

Fall from horse. On Saturday last a girl, daughter of a prospector named Connop, residing near Windellama, met with a very serious accident. It appears that while coming into Windellama her horse fell with her, and when picked up she was unconscious and bleeding from the nose, ears, and mouth. The unfortunate girl was taken to Goulburn and was attended by Dr. McMaster; she has been admitted into the hospital, and is still in a critical condition. We learn that the condition of the patient has now improved.

*(Goulburn Herald 22 July 1892 Page 6)*

Buggy accident. Mr. J. D. Brown, a miner at Windellama, met with an accident whilst driving home from Goulburn. When crossing the railway line in Sloane Street his horse swerved and capsized the buggy, throwing Brown violently to the ground, by which his collar-bone was broken and one of his ears nearly taken off. Dr. McMaster attended the injuries, and then directed the removal of the sufferer to the hospital. On inquiry today we learn that the injuries were not of a dangerous nature and that with care Mr. Brown would soon recover.

*(Goulburn Herald 14 July 1893 Page 5)*

Bolting horse. Mr. Thomas Cartwright of Windellama, met with a rather serious, accident on Thursday last. He was returning home from Moore's store, where he had attended Mr. Shadler's meeting of electors, when the horse he was riding, a young animal, became restive and bolted. The saddle turned and Mr. Cartwright was thrown with great force against a fence. After some time, though much injured, he managed to return to Mr. Moore's house, where he has since been confined to his bed, suffering from an injury to the loins and ribs. All that attention and sympathy can do is being done by friends and neighbours to restore the poor fellow to health.

*(Goulburn Evening Penny Post 12 July 1894 Page 4)*

Rider thrown onto stump. On Tuesday, 10th July, Mr. W. Ryan of Eden Farm met with a painful accident whilst in the act of mounting a young horse, which underwent a series of buck-jumping, throwing its rider on a stump and severely hurting him. He was removed to the hospital on Wednesday, where he is progressing favourably.

*(Goulburn Herald 20 July 1894 Page 3)*

## SPECIALIST TRAINING COURSES

Once a person has completed the initial Rescue & Immediate Care Course to become a WIRES volunteer, as the course name suggests, this enables the member to rescue and give short term care to

our wildlife (excluding bats and venomous snakes, which require special training). The rescued animal has to be transferred as soon as possible to a species licenced carer.

To become a species licenced carer able to give long term foster care, a specialist course has to be completed for each species that a volunteer wishes to foster. This is because caring for wildlife is not a 'one size fits all' matter - each species has its own particular and specific needs - which vary greatly. It is imperative that a carer has not only the knowledge, but also the facilities to enable the rehabilitation and release necessary to ensure a successful outcome.

Therefore our branch periodically holds such specialist training courses - the most recent one being a two day Flying Fox and Microbat Course held during June. This was well attended, not only by members of our branch, but also by members of other branches and other wildlife organisations. It covered such things as identifying different species, feeding, housing etc, as well as rescue techniques and rehydration - particularly how to release animals from entanglement in netting and barbed wire, which sadly is a regular happening. Becoming a bat rescuer and/or foster carer also entails being vaccinated against Lyssavirus which, as I am sure most readers will know, can be carried by bats and is life threatening without vaccination. Non-vaccinated members are simply not allowed to handle these animals at all.

All specialist carers have to keep their species knowledge up-to-date, and therefore it is a requirement of retaining their licence that they attend a specialist course by way of a refresher every three years.

It can be seen from this that being a wildlife carer requires dedication and commitment - it certainly isn't for the faint hearted! However, you can be assured that the privilege of caring for our wonderful native animals, and the joy of a successful release and return to the wild makes it all very worthwhile!






