Windellama Rural Fire Brigade

During May, Windellama brigade responded to two incidents. One was a single vehicle accident on Oallen Ford Rd. Fortunately there were no injuries, but the car required towing. A timely reminder that with travel increasing we need to remember to drive safely and that non- local traffic is increasing so be aware of drivers who are not familiar with our roads.

The other incident for May we attended was a bushfire that burnt out a windrow of almost 500m². We attended with seven firefighters using the Captain's vehicle and two tankers



- You must notify all adjoining neighbours and the RFS fire control centre ((02) 6226 3100) at least 24 hours before lighting up.
- You must supervise the burn at all times after lighting and ensure it is definitely out before leaving it unattended.
- Piles should not be greater than 2 m in length or width 1.5 m in height and cleared to 4.5 m
- Before lighting consider the weather for the day of your planned burn and also several days afterwards and only light the pile if conditions are calm.

All planned burns are registered on a database which means the RFS and other emergency services won't be unnecessarily called out to a smoke sighting which is your pile burn.

The Windellama brigade highly values our regular training as it combines theory with practical to ensure we do our best for the community as well as keeping things safe. With Covid-19 restrictions we have not been able to have face-to-face training but we our members have been using online training modules. Shortly we will be conducting assessments in a COVID19 safe environment for some of our new members to become qualified Bush firefighters. The online Bush Fire fighter modules are also an excellent refresher for any members who were unable to attend many callouts last season and completed their qualifications before December 2018.



April Rainfall

April this year saw a total rainfall off 78mm at our place.

May Rainfall

May rainfall has got off to it's usual poor start start with only 5mm recorded so far at our place. Actually, the last 3 years for April we have averaged 21.5mm. So maybe, we might get a bit more?

Fruit Trees

With the change of season upon us, the fruit trees are starting to get their autumn colouring and it will be soon time to give their final prune. All low branches and damaged ones to get the chop – removed.

When all leaves have fallen it will be a good time to apply the first spray to control different mites and leaf curl. Lime Sulfur is good, or otherwise copper based products is the alternative. When you use these products you must saturate the tree and surrounds. Also, one or two follow up sprays at just before bud burst is required.

Garden Vegetables

After we transplanted the mixture of Asian greens we received some warm days with the consequence most bolted to flower and thus seed. Asian greens in this condition can still be added to stir fries etc., but from now on I will direct sow.

Have transplanted the Brassica seedlings and Silver Beet, I have purchased netting to try and protect from the cabbage moth and it's offspring the green grub. This purchase has created another job in erecting a framework to place netting over.

Flower gardens

Jack paid a visit on Mothers day night and also the following night and in his usual manner wrecked havoc with the late flowering Dahlias and the self sown Tomatoes that were just starting to fruit. The dahlias after his second visit were blackened and the more vigorous ones, mush.

Flowers that are still looking good in our garden are the Snap Dragons and Yellow Calendulas with the Pink Dianthus starting to bloom.

Flower seed mixes that were recommended for planting at this time of year were scattered around are shooting up here and there. We certainly got a good mixture with lots I can't recognise yet. Hope they are not weeds! At our place we have decided on mass plantings of flowering plants that hopefully will self seed. In a few days in places that have bare spots, more seeds will be scattered.

Bird Life

With the arrival of the cooler weather the robins have turned up as have other smaller birds. Certainly crazy weather but maybe the warmer weather received earlier had the ducks and wrens producing and raring more young.

We are starting to get increased numbers of Indian Minor Birds – bloody pests, I have seen them take over Rosellas nesting sites and actually build their nest on top of young Rosellas. With the consequence the young Rosellas perish and the young Indian Minors survive. Going to have to do something about them!

It is cool enough to tidy up the garden, raking the leaves on your deciduous plants, and fruit trees.

You can place them in the compost, but don't put any with fungus on them, they can re-infect the garden..

June is the month to plant roses and fruit trees. Prepare the soil with plenty of compost ready for the planting. Some fruit tree need a pollinators , apples, nectarine, cherries, most plums, also some varieties of peach and almonds.



VEGETABLES TO SOW NOW;-

Seeds of broad beans, peas, and onion seedlings.

Rhubarb crowns can be divided and replanted , in soil with plenty of rotted manure, compost, add a balanced fertilizer and water in well.

Crown of asparagus plant can also go in.

You can divide your strawberry plants now

FLOWERS;-

Seedlings which are planted now will start flowering in the spring. Stock, pansy, viola, primula, wallflower, Russell lupins, delphiniums, foxgloves, Iceland poppies, sweet William and calendula.

This month any garden laying idle, turn the soil over roughly to open it up. The frost sweeten the soil, for spring planting.

Things to do now; Feed cyclamen as their leaves appear, using a liquid fertilizer formulated for flowering plants, and continue applications fortnightly.

Remove tired autumn –blooming annuals, enrich the soil, and replace with winter-hardy varieties such as calendula, wallflower and pansy.



Transplant evergreen shrubs such as camellia, azalea and dwarf conifer while the weather is milder.

Trim off burnt and scrappy fern fronds, then follow up with an application of fish emulsion.

Throw handfuls of garden lime into the centre of lavender bushes to keep the soil sweet and the foliage dry.

Cut back dead foliage and stems on lilliums and, if desired dig out and transplant the bulbs.

In fact, living in town was like living on another planet. As the saying goes "You can take the kid out of the country but you can't take the country out of the kid".

On to high school. Another adventure. After dad passed away midway through second year, I started to develop an interest in Music and Art which continues to this day. The Beatles and The Shadows have a lot to answer for! With a few other musicians we formed a group called The Answers and performed for socials and the like. The Answers were also regulars on afternoon program on CTC 7 TV Canberra. Later we entered the Hoadley's Battle of the Sounds and won our regional contest.

After leaving school I did a stint as an apprentice Wood Machinist at The Perway Workshop where I topped the class. There were seventeen working there and only three had a full contingent of fingers. It was time to move on to something safer which turned out to be surveying. This lasted a few years. After that finished it was time to move to the big city - Sydney!

In Sydney I found a fantastic house to rent overlooking the bay at Middle Harbour. This made living in Sydney a bit more bearable. During this time, I bought one of the first synthesizers in
